IT TAKES A CLUB & THEN SOME

We are fortunate to be a partner with the Boyertown Museum of Historic Vehicles in planning and presenting the annual Duryea Day Car Show and Flea Market each year. By providing much needed man and woman power to run this event, our club receives a portion of the income from this yearly show. This has allowed us to offer free region membership to all current members and a free Christmas Party meal to all members who volunteer to make Duryea Day the success that it has become. We are so thankful to those, and there are many, who offer their time and service each year.

For the last 10 years Tom Wright has been the chairman of the show representing our membership. He and members of the Museum staff do so much behind the scenes work in preparation for the big day. There is a team of our members along with Museum staff and volunteers and, also members of the community that meet on a regular basis starting in January to make plans for the upcoming show. Sponsors are secured, donations are sought, flyers are



prepared, dash plaques ordered, and the list goes on. In July windows cards start being readied for those who preregister. Then, a week before the show, more volunteers become involved. The group meets for the annual "stuffing of the goodie bags". Paperwork, donations from local businesses, our participation award and dash plaque are assembled, then boxed. Friday, before the show, brings a few workers out to set up tents, tables, and chairs and to unload the packed boxes. Another group works to lay out and mark the flea market area. All this "before" work gets the show off to a better start in the morning.



This year, 2024, show day was cloudy, but as they say, "the show must go on". The flea market crew arrived around 5:30 to get vendors in the spots. Registration and parking people around 6:45 and began to prepare for the arrival of what turned out to be about 500 cars and trucks plus a few cars in the car corral.

All in all, it was a good day. Spectators seemed to be plentiful, enjoying the show vehicles and

browsing the flea market. The bus running to the Museum was quite busy. After awards were presented, a crew of volunteers along with the help of a group of local Cadets, began the cleanup process, no small job for tired volunteers who had been there all day.

Many THANKS to those who helped to make Duryea Day a memorable day. Hope to see everyone next year on Saturday, August 30, 2025.
